- Case studies of real-world experiences

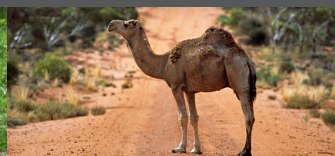
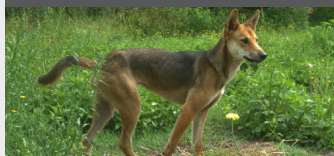
