



Office of Environment & Heritage NSW:

- Our engagement is fit for purpose

Victorian government:

- being clear about the purpose of our engagement
- knowing the history, who is affected and how they should be included
- planning engagement early
- being genuine and inclusive in our engagement
- being clear on our role and monitoring our progress

IAP2 spectrum of public participation





Arnstein's Ladder


- Non-participation

- Is it a linear process?






GENERALISED INVASION CURVE SHOWING ACTIONS APPROPRIATE TO EACH STA
